## **School Lunches**

We are fortunate to be enrolled in the Ka Ora, Ka Ako Free School Lunches scheme for all our tamariki. These nutritious lunches are provided each day by Waimangu Volcanic Valley.

## **Swimming**



Children will be swimming everyday, as it is a part of the curriculum, all students are to bring their togs and towel each day.

## Clothing

#### **Buses**

We wish to inform all Rerewhakaaitu residents that a fully automatic defibrillator is available at Trevor & Harriet Hamilton's residence 803 Ashpit Road Rerewhakaaitu around back side of Lake Rerewhakaaitu.

Because this defibrillator is fully automatic no training is required simply turn on and place the pads on the patient, the device takes over.
