This term we have been studying geology and volcanoes, especially features around our area and a close look at Mount Tarawera. On Wednesday, we had a fantastic trip to Waimangu Volcanic Valley where children were able to experience spectacular volcanic craters, enormous hot water springs, beautiful geothermal features, rare and unusual plant life and take a trip on the boat around lake Rotomahana, most children were able to have a go driving the boat as well!! Thank you to our whanau members that were able to help us on the trip.

Tuesday we had a large crew of 20 students that attended and took part in the RATS duathlon. All children put in their very best effort and did our community and school proud. Congratulations to all of our competitors, and well done to our podium placers: **Evelyn 1st** and **Finn 3rd** in their year levels. Ka pai!

The Education Review Office have circled back to us and we will be continuing the review that was started in 2023. Leanne Angland will be the lead review officer and will be accompanied by Zeb Nicklin. I have had the initial meeting and we are in the process of gathering all of the paper work and evidence for their visit.

Attendance - Our 2025 Target is: To improve attendance and engagement to 75% of students attending 90% or higher.

We had 23% of our students with 100% attendance. Well done those students.

Unfortunately our 90% attendance rate has dropped to 72% - our target is 75%.
