

Botanical investigations

For the last two weeks Tarawera and Kakaremea have been learning about invasive species. Miss Gow has been teaching about invasive animals while Miss Harris has been teaching about invasive plants, after a week with one teacher the houses switch over.

Kakaramea learnt about Thistle, Blackberry, Mexican Daisy and German Ivy. We became botanists, and looked at how botanists in the past used to study plants and record them without technology. Then we created our own botanical journals with sketches of invasive plants that affect New Zealand.














Rakau
