We are fortunate to be enrolled in the Ka Ora, Ka Ako Free School Lunches scheme for all our tamariki. These nutritious lunches are provided each day by Waimangu Volcanic Valley.

Swimming

Children will be swimming everyday, as it is a part of the curriculum, all students are to bring their togs and towel each day.

Buses / Pick up

Years 3-6 Incrediball Cricket (6 aside teams)

- Incrediball is a modified game of cricket using a soft ball / plastic gear.
- Teams are 6 aside (not 8 aside as in previous years)
- It is suited for children who understand the basics of cricket or have reasonably developed hand-eye coordination.
- Games held Thursday, 3.30pm until 5pm (approx.) at Smallbone Park. Devon Street.
- 15th February until 21st March 2024 and costs \$10 per player for Term 1.
- Incrediball teams are required to have an adult present to help muster the children
- Scoring and running the game is taken care of by Rotorua Cricket Association .
- Mixed genders and all equipment is provided.
- Schools register a whole 'team' but if you do not have enough, please let me know as we can generally form 'combined' teams of keen children.
- Registrations close on Monday 12th February.

Years 0-3 SuperSmash Cricket

- Supersmash Cricket is an entry level, coached programme and is best suited to children 5-8 years old, and designed to help participants learn the basics of cricket
- 6-week programme from mid-February to mid from 3.45pm 4.45pm at Smallbone Park.
- Children can attend either a TUESDAY or a THURSDAY afternoon session.
- Cost is \$30 for the 6-week programme
