Using textbooks to practice our new strategy




<u>Maths in Mahuri</u> We LOVE maths in Mahuri! We always start our maths lessons with our 'Daily 10' warm up; a series of 10 basic facts questions in 10 minutes. We

then break off into groups and rotate around all stations in the classroom. One group works with me - learning new maths strategies, another group will be working independently or in pairs practicing their number strategies and basic facts, and the other rotation is fun maths games - these are mainly basic facts and knowledge based games and activities that they can play with their group peers. A favourite game this week was "Dice Wars" - each person (pairs) rolls a dice and then they race to either add or multiply the two numbers together.
