

Principal Report

Kia ora e te whānau, we are reaching the end of another fantastic week! Our teaching staff have been actively training in the Better Start Literacy Approach which is designed to give your child a strong foundation in reading and writing. This approach focuses on teaching your child how to read, rather than simply expecting them to read independently. Through systematic phonics instruction, they learn the sounds of letters and how they blend together to form words. To support their learning at home, your child will bring home carefully selected books. Sometimes, a book may stay home for the entire week, allowing for repeated readings that build fluency and deeper understanding. Other weeks, a new book might only come home once, depending on their learning focus and the need for practice with specific skills. Reading these books with you reinforces the skills learned in class and fosters a love of reading. Through engaging activities, games, and these take-home books, your child will develop essential skills in decoding, spelling, and comprehension. We believe Better Start will empower your child to become a confident and enthusiastic reader. We appreciate you supporting your child on this important journey.

Y8 student, Chase, has been away adventuring this week on camp with the Kotui Ako VLN Rural group in Wellington. Being away on these camps provides a fantastic opportunity to connect with other young people from different parts of Aotearoa. The fun doesn't stop there! We'll also have a range of family-friendly games to keep the energy high and the smiles wide. And what's a birthday without cake? A few of our seniors will be helping DOC next Wednesday, 21st May, with native threatened plant – carex monitoring. DOC rangers are currently working on a carex monitor and weed control to protect the population, and is being undertaken this year at sites around Lake Rerewhakaaitu. This mahi is usually done in April/May. The population at the RLC campground (Guy Roe Reserve on Brett Rd) is generally found along the lake margin/grass strip at the lake edge of the campground. This represents our biggest population of Carex cirrhosa. A note will go home with the selected students.

We are very fortunate to have staff with a wide range of skills and abilities.




