




What can we recycle kerbside?

- Plastics 1, 2 and 5 go in the yellow lid bin. Rinse and remove lids (unless they're attached like strawberry punnets).
- Glass bottles and jars go in the blue crate, rinsed and with lids removed.
- Plastic containers and tubs over 4L cannot be recycled as they're too big for the sorting machine.
- Small items like ripped up paper, bottle caps, takeaway sauce containers and even ice-cream container lids can't be recycled. They're either too small to be identified by the sorting machine or too flat.
- If in doubt, throw it out! Polystyrene, clothes, nappies and household plastics like coat hangers cannot be recycled.
