

What's been happening in Råkau this week? Art: We've been learning about shapes in Art to help support us when we advertise for Market Day.



Our Individual Grants (IG) programme provides one-off funding for something your child needs. The good news is, your child doesn't have to be part of the Kiwi Kid Sponsorship programme to be eligible for an Individual Grant

An Individual Grant pays for a one-off need such as...

- Everyday essentials (such as clothing, car seats and shoes)
- · School costs (including uniforms, stationery, activity fees, school camps, and
- Digital devices for school (for children aged 8 or older)
- Extra-curricular activities (like sports lessons, music lessons, club fees, and uniforms)
- Medical fees (covering doctor's fees, prescriptions, glasses, medical, and mobility costs)
- · Beds and bedding (beds, cots, bedding packs)

You can apply for an Individual Grant if you have a valid Community Services Card and your child is aged between 0-18.
